- There is wheelchair access from the street through the Annexe main door and assistance dogs are very welcome.
- We have two toilets (one disabled) in the Annexe.
- A loop system is available for the hard of hearing & large print copies of our service books are available from the sidespeople.
- During all 10.00 am services there is a crèche and toys, activities and highchairs are available in the Annexe.
- There is Sunday Club for older children during the 10.00 am service in term time.
- Everyone is very welcome to receive bread and wine regardless of denomination. If you would prefer not to receive communion, you are still very welcome to come forward for a blessing. Please keep your hands below the alter rail to show this is your intention.
- Gluten free wafers and non-alcoholic wine are available. If you would like either of these, please speak to one of the people who welcomed you today.
- Collections are made during most services but there are donation envelopes and a wall safe at the back of Church.
- Please feel free to take leaflets, handouts and other information at the back of Church and on the table in the Annexe.
- There is a small lending library in the Annexe.
- There are refreshments on offer in the Annexe after all 10.00 am Sunday services.
