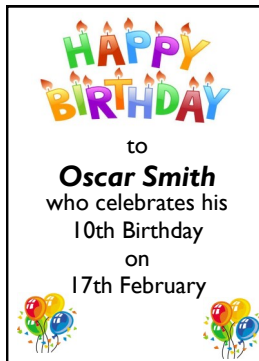

Our Mission in This Month is Tear fund in Cambodia

Tearfund has been working in Cambodia for 30 years. It has a population of more than 15 million. Most people work in the garment industry or in farming. Despite some strides forward, rural poverty remains a huge issue and the overall quality of life in Cambodia is poor for many millions.

It is estimated that 3 million people live on less than £1.45 a day and 30% of children work as labourers often distant from their homes. This puts them at risk of exploitation and human trafficking. Tearfund's Cambodian

Hope Organisation (CHO) is working through local churches to train, resource, educate and release people from physical, spiritual and mental poverty. Our annual giving to Tearfund is helping them to do that.
